HOUSE POLICY RESPONSIBLE SERVICE of ALCOHOL

Responsible Service of Alcohol (RSA) refers to the service, consumption and promotion of alcoholic products in a manner that minimises the potential harm that may be caused by alcohol consumption to individuals, their families and the community generally.

- Club Scotts recognises that it is against the law to serve any person to intoxication.
- Club Scotts recognises that it is against the law to serve or supply alcohol to any person under the age of 18.
- Club Scotts recognises that it is against the law to allow intoxicated, disruptive or violent behaviour to occur on the premises
- Additionally Club Scotts seeks to ensure that no harm comes to patrons as a result of our service of alcohol.
- Club Scotts strives to foster responsible service of alcohol practices amongst patrons and staff. This is achieved by implementing and maintaining various harm minimisation and consumer protection measures as outlined in this policy.

Club Scotts Mission Statement

To properly conduct alcohol related services in a lawful and socially responsible manner, having regard to potential harm and community concerns about alcohol consumption.

Participation in a Liquor Accord

Club Scotts is an active member of the Nambucca Valley Liquor Accord.

Responsible Service of Alcohol - Policies and Measures

Club Scotts has adopted the following policies and measures to fulfil its stated RSA commitment:

- Offers a range of drinks on premises. These include a range of non-alcoholic beverages.
- Discourages excessive drinking. We do not serve shots or doubles nips.
- Provides ice water on a complimentary basis.
- Seeks to create an environment that discourages drunken, disruptive or violent behaviour.

- Does not seek to encourage rapid or excessive consumption of alcohol through pricing
- Low alcohol beers and non-alcoholic beverages are stocked and promoted.
- Staff have been acquainted with this House Policy and training to implement it.
- The Club displays all legally required RSA signs.

Under Age Drinking

- Club Scotts has surveillance procedures which can detect under age persons seeking to enter the premises.
- If a staff member believes that a person, who is ordering or being supplied alcohol, is under 18 years of age, they will politely request proof of age (Passport, RTA Photo Card or Photo Drivers Licence).
- If the person is less than 18 years of age, or refuses to produce identification, staff will refuse service and ask the person to leave Club premises.
- An incident book is maintained to record all instances of underage entry or attempted entry.
